Types of involvement

University-centered:

Host a regional event for your organization's alumni/ae or for a group of Fraternities & Sororities.

Example: All Sorority/Society luncheon in Atlanta

Attend networking opportunities

Present workshops at leadership conferences

Share news, events, etc. on your social media

Organization-centered:

Volunteer for the local advisory board, even if the closest chapter isn't at WFU

Join your local alumni/ae chapter

Apply to serve as a workshop facilitator

Volunteer for your national foundation

Offer to share your expertise in a membership development workshop

Share news, events, etc. on your social media

Make sure your contact information is updated with the national organization

Volunteer for regional events

Offer to write for, submit stories idea to, or advertise in the national magazine
