Advanced Placement scores must be reported to Wake Forest University directly from the College Board (use College code 5885).

Special Note: Students entering in or after Fall 2007 cannot use Advanced Placement courses to satisfy WFU divisional requirements; however, AP credit will count towards the 120 hours needed for graduation.
