- 3. VOTE: Resolutions: Please see attachment for complete text. These resolutions come from a committee, were proposed last month, and come to the senate today for a vote.
 - a. Integration Committee Resolution #1: That the University administration articulate their commitment to and prioritization of integration across all of the Wake Forest University Campuses.
 - i. Chair called for discussion
 - 1. Who decides if resolution is satisfied?
 - 2. Per the bylaws, the President has to respond to any resolutions in her address to the senate which is scheduled for April 10
 - ii. Called for a vote no opposition
 - b. Integration Committee Resolution #2: That the University's administration develops a working group of stakeholders and those who can go beyond just identifying needs and barriers and start creating workable solutions.
 - i. Chair called for discussion
 - 1. Establishing the working group is the measure
 - 2. Approving the resolution obligates a response
 - 3. Working group would be more of an ad hoc group that would have a term of a couple of years and would b ethe clearing house for solutions
 - ii. Called for a vote no opposition

 - i. heard from a student athlete re: her transfer experience; overall it was positive, but missteps along the way especially with financial
 - ii. Clemson has filed lawsuit against ACC (along with FL state); waiting to see what the courts do
- g. Fringe Benefits not a pretty picture
 - i. 21% over budget for Jan & Feb 23% over budget last year (Sept-Dec) more claims mean higher premiums
 - ii. What portion of the insurance pool is paid by the university we pay 40, they pay 60; think the split will stay the same
 - iii. Another meeting 3/27 at 2pm
 - 1. The entire Benefits Committee can attend the meetings with HR
 - 2. Staff Advisory Council also has a Benefits Committee that attends the meetings
 - iv. We're self-insured so a small pool
 - v. Bundling of medical and pharmacy doesn't seem to be a factor
 - vi. Aware that we're incentivized to use Atrium providers but there is a shortage of providers available
