# **Presentation Highlights and Resources:**

- The Council was welcomed by Provost Rogan Kersh, who shared an update on the University:
  - Wake Forest continues to advance the important work of belonging and inclusion.



### WAKE FOREST UNIVERSITY

- At this year's Founder's Day Convocation in February, Wake Forest President Nathan O. Hatch acknowledged the University's participation in the institution of slavery. He offered an apology for how Wake Forest benefitted from the labor and sale of enslaved people. - Academically, we continue to navigate the shifting tides of Higher Education, pursuing more online/blended learning opportunities, enhancing learning spaces, and moving forward with piloting the residential college model as an anchor of belonging from a student's first day on campus.
- On April 23, all faculty will participate in an <u>inclusive teaching conference</u> featuring nationally prominent scholars.
- Christina Soriano, Associate Provost for the Arts and Interdisciplinary Initiatives,
   Associate Professor of Dance, joined by students Kamryn King ('20); Christina McGee
   ('21); and Donna Moseley ('20), provided an interactive presentation from Wake the
   Arts.
  - They shared about the nationally-recognized IMPROVment® program and associated research, which is founded and spearheaded by Christina. This is a multidisplinary program, marrying neuroscience and dance/movement to bring neurological benefits to older adults with neurodegenerative diseases. The three students present shared about their experience teaching IMPROVment classes and helping with the clinical research trial.
  - The goal of Wake the Arts is to lift up the Arts on campus and in our community, and to enhance and increase the role that Arts play in each WFU student's experience.

- We turned our attention to the School of Business, and specifically to the <u>Master of Science in Business Analytics (MSBA) program</u>. **Jeff Camm**, Associate Dean of Business Analytics, Professor & Inmar Presidential Chair in Business Analytics was joined by MSBA students Nicole Onwuchekwa (MS '20); Wade Smith (MS '20); and Zoey Wang (MS '20).
  - The MSBA program is designed with the input of our corporate partners to meet their industry needs. Their feedback is clear — we need performance-ready analysts who demonstrate business knowledge and exceptional communication skills.
    - Wake Forest is uniquely positioned to provide excellent technical skills education while delivering the communication and interpersonal skills critical to success in the high-demand analytics industry.
  - The MSBA program currently boasts a 100% employment rate. The Class of 2020 has 87 students with an average GPA of 3.45, representing 61 Colleges & Universities and 32 Undergraduate Majors.
- Some members of the Parents' Council participated in a *Career Connects* event hosted by the Office of Personal and Career Development. Thank you to those who offered their expertise and time to our students!
- Olga Pierrakos, Founding Chair and Professor, Department of Engineering, brought an update from one of WFU's newest departments, located at Wake Downtown. She was joined by several Engineering students.
  - Engineering equips our leaders to solve the grand challenges of society.
  - 150 total students in the Engineering Department. 43 will graduate in May with the inaugural cohort.
  - We are the only school in the nation to embed leadership and character into the Engineering curriculum.



- Saturday began with a Conversation about Leadership and Character, with
   President Nathan Hatch and Michael Lamb, Executive Director of the Program for Leadership and Character, Assistant Professor of Politics, Ethics, and
   Interdisciplinary Humanities.
  - Dr. Hatch is deeply committed to ensuring that WFU is focused on integrating
    education and character. His longtime motto has been "bet on people, not on
    strategies" and this played out in our recruiting of Michael Lamb from the Oxford
    Character Project.
  - Wake Forest is committed to Pro Humantiate in a real way, not as "just a slogan."
     The Leadership and Character Initiative has support from the top leaders of WFU as well as from some of the world's best leaders and scholars in the field.
  - All students have the opportunity to take classes that incorporate Leadership & Character, beginning with a First Year Seminar. Discussion groups are also offered, with 80 students participating thus far.
  - Michael Lamb and team are performing detailed qualitative and quantitative studies to measure and improve the efficacy of the Leadership & Character curriculum.
  - Lilly Endowment Inc. has awarded Wake Forest University a \$3.4 million grant to develop and expand its Program for Leadership and Character. The three-year grant will support student programming, faculty engagement and academic research. Read more <a href="here">here</a>.

- The <u>Silicon Valley Practicum</u> is a new program expanding on the great success of the Summer Management Program (SMP). This internship program is designed for students who have completed the SMP, and provides hand-on, real world work experience in the Bay Area. Students are supervised by Professor Andy Chan, working 4 days a week in their internship placements, and receive personal mentoring and coaching from Andy each Friday.

- Think *Hard, Talk Fast*: **Debate at Wake Forest**, with **Jarrod Atchison** ('01, MA '03), Associate Professor of Communication and Director of the Debate program, and Debate students
  - Wake Debate continues to be a powerhouse program, nationally recognized and incredibly competitive.
  - Wake Debate is tied with Harvard for the most wins in the past 10 years.
  - Wake's team has won two National Championships, and finished in the Final Four six additional times.
  - There are 28 Debaters on the team.
  - The concept of an engaged Liberal Arts education is built on the idea that learning is not simply memorization and regurgitation, but on deep critical thinking skills, consideration and understanding of all perspectives.
