

The Difference

Interfraternity Council

- Interfraternity Council 1st Established Council for Fraternal Organizations.
- Exclusively Male Membership
- Social Organizations with Philanthropic Ties
- 1st Council Established on campus, followed by the Panhellenic and National Pan-Hellenic Council respectively
- Our gender breakdown is about 37% of undergraduate men are in fraternities, and about 60% of undergraduate women are in sororities.
- Average Cost: \$200 \$500 per month
- We have a total of 10 Organizations in this council

Panhellenic Council

- Second established council nationally
- All women's organizations
- Social and Philanthropic by nature
- Undergraduate commitment with volunteer opportunities post graduation
- Average cost- \$200-\$500 per month
- Total of 8 Organizations here at Wake

National Pan-Hellenic Council "Divine 9"

- Third council established.
- Composed of fraternities and sororities
- Lifetime commitments
- Range of Initiation Fee- \$1,000-\$2,500
- Yearly dues during undergraduate-\$100-\$200.
- 5 currently established here at Wake adding 2 over the next two years
- Currently housing 1 multicultural sorority

Wake Forest University Recruitment Requirements

2.5 University grade point average

12 credit hours completed as a matriculated student (no AP/IB credits)

Must complete FSL PreventZone Module

Interfraternity Council Recruitment

- IFC hosts both fall and spring formal recruitment.
 - Fall Recruitment is limited to upperclassmen students.
 - Spring Recruitment is open to all students (first year students may participate) - January 18th - January 25th, 2024
- Prospective members attend various events to get to know chapters throughout the year
- The university has no control over how many bids are distributed
- Building relationships with members during the fall semester is key
- It is mutualistic selection
- Fall Recruitment is for Upperclassmen

Panhellenic Council Recruitment

- Formal recruitment takes place every spring semester. Students must register in the fall semester
 - January 10-21,2024
- Hybrid Recruitment
 - Round 1: Chapter Introductions (virtual)
 - Round 2: Philanthropy (Virtual)
 - Round 3: Sisterhood
 - Round 4: Preference
 - Bid Day
- Panhellenic uses a mutual selection process
- Recruitment is followed by a 6 week New Member Education Process







NPHC Intake

- Intake is the process where students who are interested in joining one of our historically African American fraternities and sororities or our multicultural sorority can explore their options.
 - These organizations are open to all
- Intake takes place at various times throughout the year depending on when a chapter is eligible to accept new members.
- 6-8 week process, usually followed by a new member presentation
- During this time aspirants learn organization and chapter history.



Myth or Fact


- The office of Fraternity & Sorority Life can force a chapter to extend an invitation (MYTH)
- Panhellenic offers a chance for membership outside of formal recruitment (TRUE)
- I have to consent to pledging/hazing for membership (MYTH)
- I am guaranteed membership if my parents were members (MYTH)
- I can join an unrecognized organization (?)

Unrecognized Organizations

- Delta Kappa Epsilon (DKE) -also referred to as DEKES and Psi Delta. Delta Kappa Epsilon lost university recognition in October 2018 through at least May 2022. Delta Kappa Epsilon is recognized by the national organization.
- Kappa Sigma- also referred to as Kappa Sig, KSig, Delta Omega, and Siggies. Kappa Sigma lost university recognition in 2013. A re-established chapter is recognized by the national organization, but it does not have university recognition.
- Theta Chi- also referred to as Tachi. Theta Chi lost recognition in June 2023. Theta Chi will be eligible for return for the Fall 2027 semester
