

The mission of the Center for Learning, Access, and Student Success (CLASS) is to provide opportunities for all students to achieve academic success







CLASS by the numbers

In the 2023-2024 school year:

- 996 undergraduate students total (approximately 19%) received disability related accommodations.
- 2992 student meetings with CLASS staff for academic coaching or disability-related needs.
- **3051** total hours of peer-tutoring were provided to undergraduate students by CLASS tutors.
- 190 outreach events to students, faculty, staff, and other campus constituencies.



ACADEMIC COACHING

- One-on-one sessions for students
- Informed by research, best practice, and our own assessment
- Focused on enhancing academic skills including, but not limited to:
 - Performance anxiety
 - Test-taking and preparation
 - Time management
 - Study techniques and strategies



ACCOMMODATIONS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Resources regarding the process available on the <u>class.wfu.edu</u> website The process includes:

- Disclose: Notify CLASS about the need for accommodations and provide appropriate documentation. This may be done via the <u>student</u> <u>portal</u> on our website
- 2. **Verify**: CLASS staff will review documentation and accommodations request
- 3. **Implement**: CLASS staff will begin interactive process with the student to help facilitate implementation of reasonable accommodations
