Full Immersion Program

Students go abroad and study with students from U.S. institutions and also have the opportunity to take courses at local universities

Summer Programs

- Faculty-led & affiliate
- Typically 4-8 weeks
- Internship opportunities
- Scholarships available
- A full list of WFU summer programs will be available at the Study Abroad Fair in September.

Short-Term Programs

- Embedded study abroad opportunities
- Take a class over Spring semester and go abroad over Spring Break or in May
- Up to two weeks abroad taught by WFU Faculty
- Locations such as Belize,
 Greece, Venice, and Scotland

Receiving Credit

- Previously approved course lists available in Workday.
- Students can seek additional course approvals on Affiliate programs.
- WFU programs are great for completing divisionals!
- Speak with your major/minor advisor and Office of Academic Advising about any credit limits you may need to be aware of.









Financing Your Experience

- On a Wake Forest program, students will be charged for WFU tuition, fees, and housing.
- On Affiliate abroad programs, students will pay Wake Forest tuition, with housing and other fees billed directly to the student by the Affiliate program provider.
- Most merit and need-based funding can be used for approved study abroad programs.

Steps to Studying Abroad

Renew your passport. Must be valid for 6 months after you return.

It's never too early

Go to www.studyabroad.wfu.edu to browse approved programs.

Set up an appointment with a study abroad advisor and complete an advising form.

At least 1-2 semesters before you plan to go abroad

Apply to 2-3 programs.
