

- Not a Major or Minor
- A "pathway through the university" comprising
 - Individual Advising
 - Co-Curricular Programming
 - Curricular Offerings
- Mission: Advise students' as they discern their emerging professional identities and support an intellectual community that fosters the values, guiding principles, wellbeing practices, and habits of character that will one day guide their professional practice.

What is Pre-Law

- Four Years* at-a-Glance
 - First-Year & Sophomore Years
 - Excell in classes | Explore the University | Declare a Major/Minor
 - Summer Pre-Law Program or Summer Internship
 - Junior Year
 - Create Prospective Law School List | Prepare for and take LSAT
 - Senior Year
 - Complete Law School Applications | Graduate (on time)

Where do WFU Pre-Law students go after graduation?

- Accession Rate: 85% Overall | 93% Seniors
 - Mean LSAC GPA: 3.66
 - Mean LSAT: 162

How can I support my child on the journey to law school?

Things to do:

- **Empower** your child to self-advocate
