#### Who Can Work

#### **Eligibility**

 Any degree seeking student enrolled at WFU.

### **Application & Hiring Process**

#### From Application to First Paycheck

- CRITICAL: Federal Form I-9 must be completed within <u>3</u> business days of their hire date.
- Workday System: All employment tasks are managed here.
- Communication: Students must check their WFU email frequently.

#### What's it Like?

- Average 5-10 hrs/week; max 20 hrs/week during school year.
- Can hold multiple positions.
- Your Deac is a student first!
  - Maximum of 20 hours per week during the school year (even with multiple positions).
  - 30 hours maximum during official University breaks and vacations (Winter Break/Summer).

#### What's it Like?

- Like a "regular" job
- Professional behavior
- Arrive on time
- Check In/Out every shift
- Work appropriate attire
- Perform your best!



#### Federal Work Study (FWS)

- Work Study is a need based fund that students may be awarded in their Financial Aid Package.
- There is no difference in pay or expectations between a work-study and non-work-study job.



### Federal Work Study (FWS)



#### FWS Eligibility

- If your student submitted a FAFSA and were awarded aid, it is possible they have federal work-study. They can log into the financial aid portal to see if they were awarded FWS one.wfu.edu
