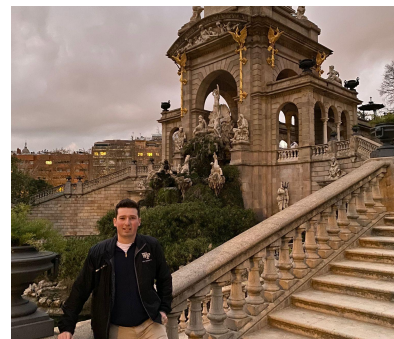

- Meet with a study abroad advisor early!



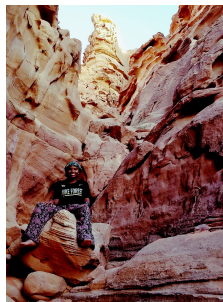
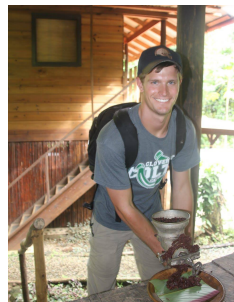

Affiliate Programs

Approved programs offered through third party providers or other universities

Center-Based Program

Students go abroad and study with students from WFU and other U.S. institutions

Direct Enroll Program

Students are enrolled in a local university where they study and live with students from their host country

Hybrid Program

Students go abroad and study with students from U.S. institutions and also have the opportunity to take courses at local universities

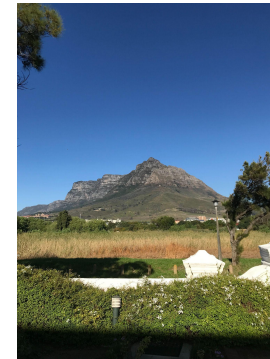
WFU Summer & Short Term Programs

Summer Programs

- Faculty-led & affiliate
- Typically 4-8 weeks
- Internship opportunities
- Scholarships available
- A full list of WFU summer programs will be available at the Study Abroad Fair in September.

Short-Term Programs

- Embedded study abroad opportunities
- Take a class over Fall or Spring semester and go abroad over Winter Break, Spring Break, or in May
- Up to two weeks abroad – taught by WFU Faculty



Financing Your Experience

- On a Wake Forest program, students will be charged for WFU tuition, fees, and housing.
- On Affiliate abroad programs, students will pay Wake Forest tuition, with housing and other fees billed directly to the student by the Affiliate program provider.
- Most merit and need-based funding can be used for approved study abroad programs.

Apply to Study Abroad

- **Students (or groups) will submit the Single Application for semester abroad programs** (no separate applications for fall and spring semesters).
- The single application process is for semester programs only!
- Summer and short-term programs will continue to have individual program deadlines.
- Students can rank up to five programs in priority order
 - Applications can be submitted:
 - Individually
 - In a group of up to 4 people (for the fall semester only)
 - In a group of up to 10 people (for the spring semester only)
- Applications for programs in the 2027-28 academic year are due **December 13, 2026 at 11:59 pm.**
- Decision notifications will be provided to students on January 15, 2027.

Apply to Study Abroad

Also...

- Single application information is only relevant to first year students who would like to be abroad during the sophomore year.
- **Applying doesn't mean you have to go! Submitting a single application provides a possible acceptance but isn't a commitment to participate.**
- A second round application process will open in January 2027. This will be for Spring 2028 programs only.



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Recap

- Individualized advising to help students find the program that meets their academic and personal goals
- Semester, Summer, and Short-Term study away options
- Most students go abroad sophomore or junior year
- Financial aid transfers to most programs; scholarships available
- Single application process to apply to study abroad
