WE Are Wake:

Engaging Students, Faculty and Staff in a Campus-wide Care Initiative

Because mental health is a community responsibility.

WE is about understanding what distress looks like in the Wake Forest community, knowing when and where to find help, and learning effective responses when mental health concerns arise.

WE works with our campus community to:

- Elevate our consciousness of care within the Wake Forest community.
- Promote healthy practices and preventative care awareness.
- Equip members of our community with knowledge and skills that can support their peers in need.
- Connect our community to the resources and information necessary to foster a culture of self-care.

You can submit a referral for any Wake Forest student, faculty, or staff member, including yourself, to receive caring outreach and get connected with support.

A referral initiates outreach from a case manager, who provides support, guidance, or other interventions to students in need and connect them with appropriate campus and community resources.

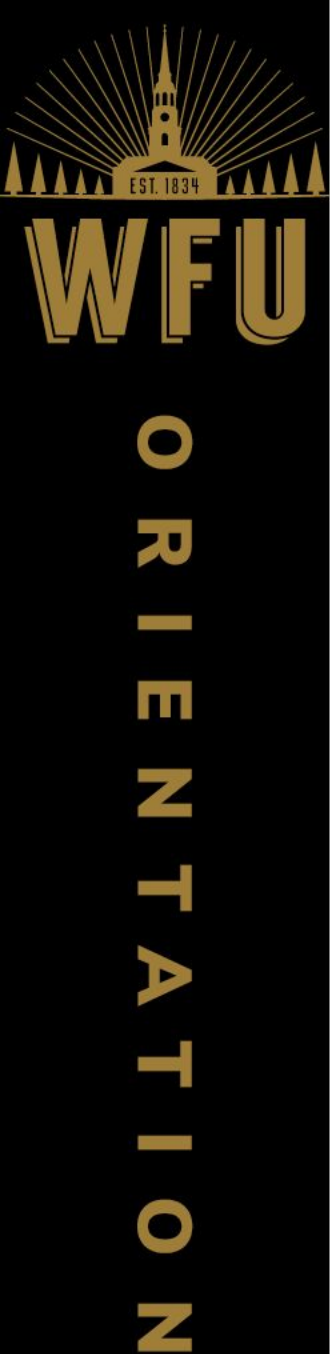
758-CARE

A 24/7 help and consultation line for WFU community members

Professional staff answer the line; will assess the concern; provide advice and strategies about next steps; schedule meetings with CARE Case Managers; and/or provide a referral to a specific staff member or office on the Reynolda campus.

758-CARE is not an emergency line

Honor Code

Wake Forest's *Honor Code* applies to student decision making in and out of the classroom, on-campus, off-campus.

*“A student pledges in all phases of life
not to cheat, plagiarize, deceive, or steal*

to preserve academic integrity *and* uphold a culture of honor

Student Code of Conduct

Sexual Misconduct Policy/Title IX

- ➔ **Recommend discussions about “consent”**

Alcohol and Other Drugs Policy

- ➔ Marijuana is still illegal in North Carolina, we must follow state and federal laws: no medical, no recreational
- ➔ Do not provide alcohol to your students, nor leave alcohol with them: liability, risk, harm, criminal charges

Proactive Medical Support Policy

- ➔ **Students seeking medical assistance** for themselves or others due to use of alcohol and/or other drugs
- ➔ **Student organizations seeking medical assistance** for their members or guests
- ➔ **Not amnesty**; still requires educational and preventative outcomes

Conduct Process

Learning-Focused

- Most outcomes are learning-focused: research papers, educational sessions, self-reflection, mentoring meetings

Accountability and Growth

- Not a legal system
- Warnings and probation to deter future misconduct
- Limited reporting outside of WFU

Development of responsible global citizens

Individually-Focused; Leadership and Character Foundations

- Adults-in-training: developing skills and learning
- Supporting good habits and good choices
- Individual outcomes for individual students: not math

Digital Citizenship

Treating others with respect and refraining from harming them is a fundamental tenet of our community. That behavioral requirement extends to all interactions, including those online and those which are purportedly anonymous.

Threatening, harassing, or bullying is harmful and not allowed in person or online. We are a community working to teach, to learn, to help, and to serve.

Community members should report unacceptable behaviors to the Dean of Students where we will provide support, work with the student to remove the posts of concern and hold accountable persons who post unacceptable material.

Some third-party platforms, including Fizz, purport to offer a layer of anonymity. Before you post or participate in harmful online behavior, please know anonymity is not absolute. In cases of misuse—such as targeted harassment, threats, disclosure of personal information or location (“doxxing”), or legal violations—digital footprints can be traced, and identities can be determined.

Online bullying can cause real harm to your student or be caused by your student.

Don't Get Scammed

Scams happen at universities, too.

Increase of spammers pretending to be Police and other officials. If *any* doubt, call WFUPD and Information Services.

Scams happen everywhere: Phone calls, texting, email, Fizz, X, Insta, facebook, whatsapp, more

Discuss “sexting” and “sextortion”: This happened several times last year. Call WFUPD, IS, Dean of Students immediately.

Tricking students by phone, text or email: Fake emails or texts about someone in jail (pledge class member, club member, etc.), bond money, gift cards. Fake identity of friend, classmate, family member. Use care about public information on social media!

Never click on links in unsolicited texts or emails: WFU IS is very good at stopping hundreds of thousands of emails a day - students must be vigilant.

Law enforcement officials will never contact you to pay: parking tickets, bail, bonds, past-due bills, etc. Includes IRS, state police, etc.+

Never purchase gift cards: 100% a scam.

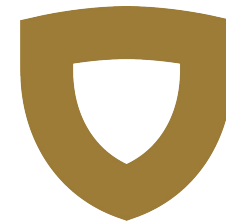

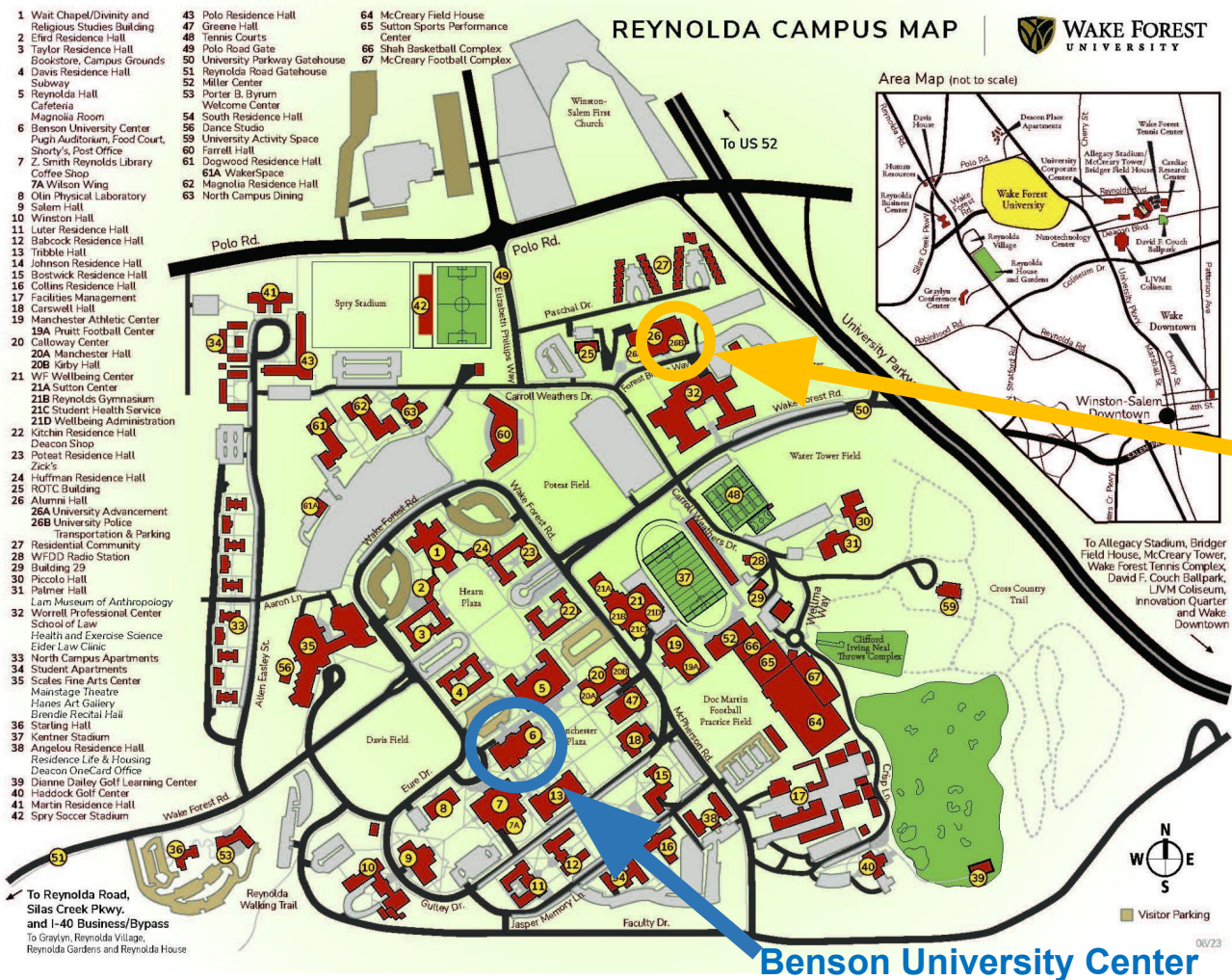


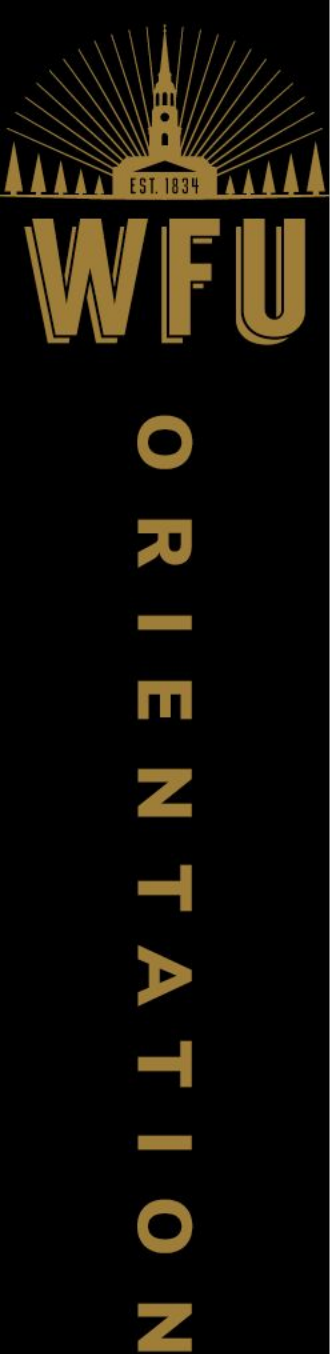

Campus Security: Security Facilities and Supporting Safety

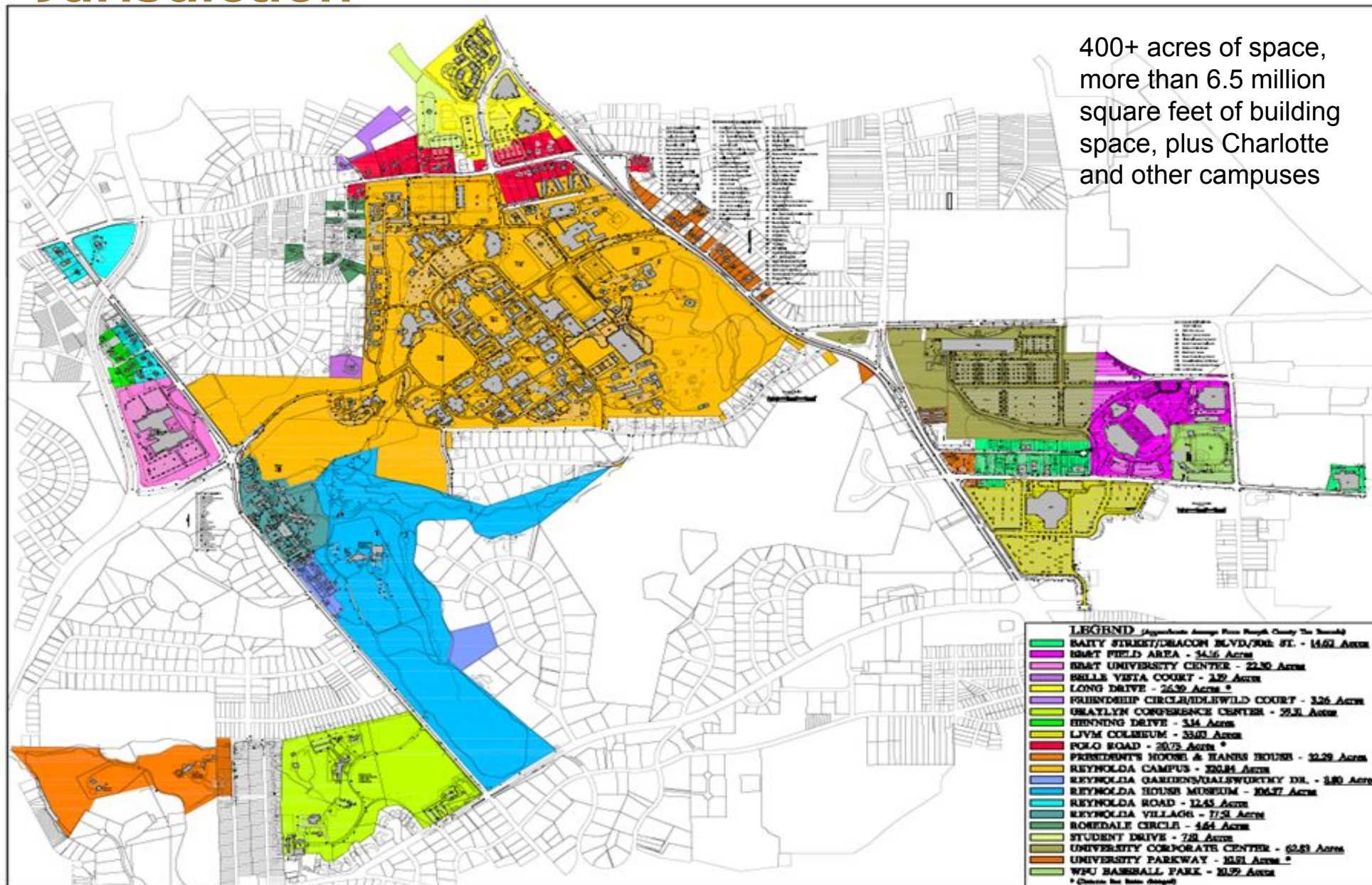
- Staffing at gates, security points

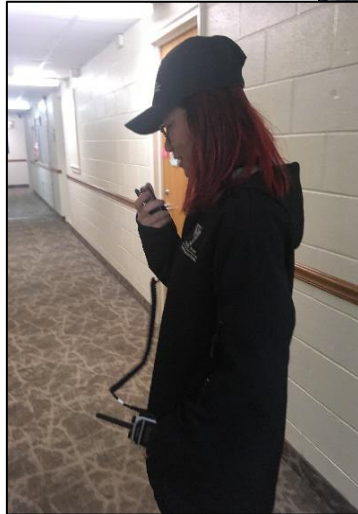

Wake Safe App: Social Escape, Mobile Blue Light



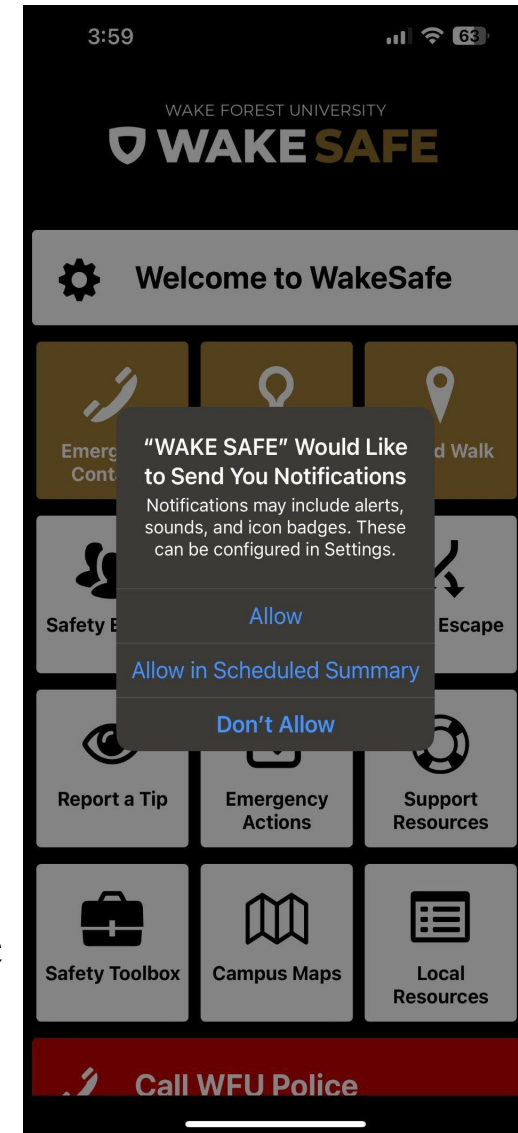
Wake Safe Phone App

Campus safety notifications: parents & families

- Download the **Wake Safe app** on your mobile device.
- You will see a popup asking you to **Allow Notifications**. Tap **Allow**
- Once you have downloaded Wake Safe and enabled notifications, if a campus alert is issued, you will receive a notice on your mobile device.

Verify that you will receive alerts on your mobile

- In your phone's **Settings**, go to **Wake Safe** and ensure that you have selected **Allow Notifications** (we encourage you to select Immediate notifications and to allow both Sounds and Badges)..



Wake Alert

Wake Alert, the University's emergency notification program, provides information and advisories via several communication channels including

- Wake Alert website - wakealert.wfu.edu
- Text Messaging **critical**: You student must add their cell to Workday. Campus closures (weather), crisis events, instructions
- Outdoor/Indoor Warning System
Weather, Safety, Fire
- E-mail, Facebook, Twitter/X [@WakeAlert](https://twitter.com/WakeAlert)
- Phone/Voice Mail
- Recorded Message on the Wake Forest Weather Line

LOCK IT

Always secure your scooter with a quality U-lock through the frame.



PARK SMART

Park in designated racks or well-lit, high-traffic areas.



RECORD IT

Record your scooter's serial number and keep a recent photo.



TRACK IT

Consider using an AirTag or other GPS tracking device.



REPORT IT

Report suspicious activity or theft immediately to WFU Police.

Available to all Wake Forest University students, faculty, and staff.

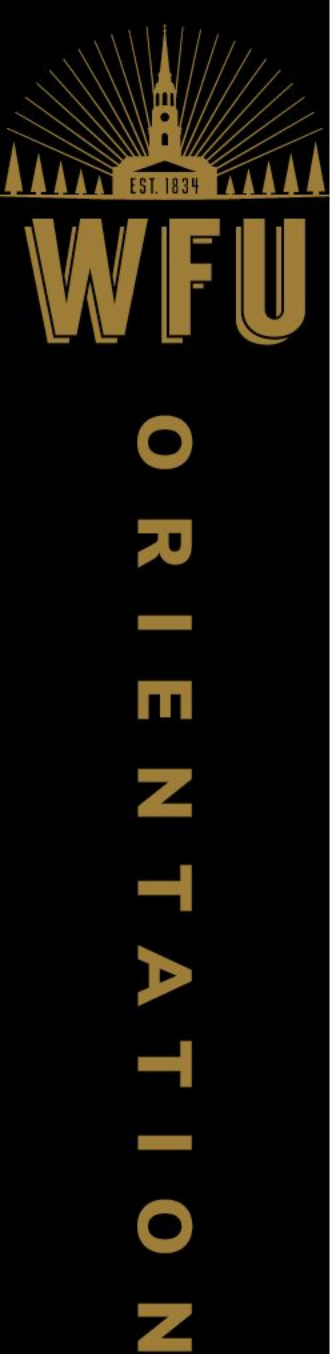
