Cross-Cultural Engagement and Reentry

Thus, you will focus on the matrix of reentry transition, learning outcomes, and expansion of the study abroad experience.

Goals of INS 152

Reflect upon and process reentry transition.

Identify and articulate learning of abroad culture and home culture.

Identify and articulate development of identity through abroad experience.

Foster curiosity and action plans for continued intercultural learning.

Foster ability to analyze cultural influences in a given context.

Identify and communicate transferable skills from abroad experience to work and life at home.
