Preparing for Cross-Cultural Engagement

CGS 150 is designed to help you maximize your study abroad experience by increasing your understanding of your host culture and exploring how you engage with people from different cultures. It will also get you thinking about the practical aspects of study abroad and give you the opportunity to further research the different cultural elements that make up your host country, all to better prepare you for your journey abroad.

Goals of CGS 150

- Learn basic facts of the host country
- Learn basic cross-cultural principles (acculturation)
- Enhance awareness of cultural self-identity (enculturation)
- Enhance awareness of the value of intercultural competence
- Gain knowledge of the cultural adjustments/transition process
- Prepare to interact and engage with individuals from the host country

Course Requirements & Expectations:

- Receive a 75% or above on your interview assignment, final project, and final reflection paper
- Complete all weekly course work*
 *While you are encouraged to complete all weekly assignments, you can miss up to three (3) individual assignments and still pass the class.

Attend class and complete quality assignments.

Log in to Canvas each week, do the readings, watch the videos, and complete the assignments. Assignments and posts on discussion boards should be thoughtful and complete.

Closely read instructions. You will have to edit or redo assignments that have deficits in content and/or quality – please take the time to do them well on your first attempt.

Modules

Each module consists of a VoiceThread lesson, various readings, videos and/or exercises to further your understanding of your host culture and consider the different perspectives to take with you during your time abroad.

Module Assignments

Each module will conclude with an assignment, which is meant to help you reflect and connect to the content covered in that module. Details for each assignment can be found in Canvas.

Study Abroad Prep Assignments

Study Abroad Prep assignments will ask you to do research or complete a task that will better prepare you for your journey abroad. These assignments are intended to help you navigate your new home once you arrive.

Country Findings Assignments

Each module will have a Country Findings assignment in which you will research a particular topic related to the country in which you will be studying abroad. This exercise is intended for you to dig deeper into the cultural pieces that make your country unique, so use this exercise to further explore your personal interests within the subjects.

Short Writing Assignments

Some weeks you will have short assignments/handouts related to the topics of the class. The Interview assignment is required and will be graded.
