PROFESSOR MEGHAN BOONE

Professor of Law

Faculty Member of the Year &

Jurist Excellence in Teaching Award Recipient

Professor Meghan Boone is a Professor of Law and Dean's Fellow at Wake Forest University School of Law where she teaches Constitutional Law, Reproductive Justice, Family Law, and Civil Procedure. She is also an affiliate faculty member in the Department of Women, Gender, & Sexuality Studies as well as the Center for Bioethics, Health, & Society. Her research focuses on issues of reproductive rights and justice, and specifically the rights of pregnant and parenting individuals.

Professor Boone came to Wake Forest Law in 2020 after serving as an assistant professor at the University of Alabama School of Law. She is a former Clinical Teaching Fellow for Georgetown University Law Center's Institute for Public Representation, a public interest law school clinic that litigated a wide variety of civil disputes. Additionally, she clerked for the Honorable Martha Daughtrey on the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals and practiced at a private firm focusing on class action public interest litigation in Washington, D.C.

Her scholarship has been selected for inclusion in multiple collections and textbooks, as well as awarded national prizes. In addition to her scholarly work, publications, and speaking engagements, she has been interviewed by numerous media outlets where she has shared her expertise on reproductive rights and justice.

PROGRAM NOTES

Academic Regalia

Academic regalia worn at college and university ceremonies dates to the Middle Ages, when monks and students used it for warmth in medieval castles and halls of learning. Doctoral robes feature broad velvet panels down the front and three velvet bars on the sleeves. The velvet may be black or a color distinctive of the degree. Master's robes have long half-moon sleeves rather than velvet panels.

Candidates for and holders of master's and doctoral degrees wear hoods over their robes. The hood symbolizes the burden of scholarship and identifies the degree level, field of study, and awarding institution. The trimming color indicates the major field of learning; for law, the academic color is purple. The colors lining the hood identify the university conferring the degree.

Honors & Academic Cords

Candidates for graduation are vested with cords signifying that they are graduating with academic honors distinction or have participated in various activities during law school.

ABOUT WAKE FOREST UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF LAW

What began in 1894 as a fledgling department within Wake Forest College has grown into the prominent and highly-ranked Wake Forest University School of Law, one of the top law schools in the country.

In 1956, the University, including the Law School, relocated from Wake Forest, North Carolina to Winston-Salem. Thirty-seven years later, the Law School moved to its new space at the Worrell Professional Center, which it shared with the School of Business until 2013. In 2017, the Law School became home to the newest North Carolina Business Court, which is still housed at Worrell today.

Beginning with the 1905 appointment of Needham Yancey Gulley as the first dean of the Law School, Wake Forest Law's tradition of exceptional leadership has persisted throughout the years, as has its reputation for outstanding teaching, scholarship, and service.

In keeping with the University's motto of *Pro Humanitate*, the Wake Forest University School of Law has continued to build on its legacy of developing not just lawyers, but "citizen lawyers," who will have a positive impact at the local, state, national, and international levels.

The following degrees are recognized at Wake Forest University School of Law:

JURIS DOCTOR (JD) — The first earned law degree indicating graduation from a law school with three years of post-baccalaureate study, or the equivalent of seven years of formal higher education, at least three years of which are law.

MASTER OF LAWS (LLM) — An earned postgraduate degree in law indicating the successful completion of one additional year of specialized legal study after receipt of the first degree in law. The Wake Forest LLM degree is for those whose first degree in law is from a university of a foreign country.

DOCTOR OF JURIDICAL SCIENCE (SJD) — An earned postgraduate degree in law indicating generally the successful completion of two years of formal legal study beyond receipt of the first degree in law plus the writing of a major original research thesis or dissertation.

MASTER OF STUDIES IN LAW (MSL) — An earned postgraduate degree in the study of law to obtain a practical understanding of the intersection of law and the workplace with an emphasis on compliance and regulation.
