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Construct Descriptions & Survey Items

Academic Disengagement measures the extent to which students engage in behaviors that are inconsistent with academic success.

Survey items and estimation "weights": *Since entering college, indicate how often you:*

- * *Fell asleep in class (1.15)*

Academic Self-Concept is a unified measure of students' beliefs about their abilities and confidence in academic environments.

Survey items and estimation "weights": *Rate yourself on each of the following traits as compared with the average person your age:*

- * *Academic ability (3.14)*
- * *Self-confidence (intellectual) (2.82)*
- * *Drive to achieve (2.28)*
- * *Mathematical ability (1.24)*

Civic Awareness measures changes in students' understanding of the issues facing their community, nation, and the world.

Survey items and estimation "weights": *Think about your current abilities and tell us how strong or weak you believe you are in each of the following areas:*

- * *Understanding of global issues (6.93)*
- * *Understanding of the problems facing my community (4.50)*

Civic Engagement measures the extent to which students are motivated and involved in civic, electoral, and political activities.

Faculty Interaction: Mentorship measures the extent to which students and faculty have mentoring relationships that foster support and guidance with respect to both academic and personal domains.

Habits of Mind is a unified measure of the behaviors and traits associated with academic success. These learning behaviors are seen as the foundation for lifelong learning.

Leadership is a unified measure of students' beliefs about their leadership development, leadership capability, and their experiences as a leader.

Negative Cross-Racial Interaction is a unified measure of students' level of negative interaction with diverse peers.

Survey items and estimation "weights": *To what extent have you experienced the following with students from a racial/ethnic group other than your own?*

- * *Had tense, somewhat hostile interactions (5.47)*

- * *Felt insulted or threatened because of your race/ethnicity (7.12)*

Overall Satisfaction is a unified measure of students' satisfaction with the college experience.

Positive Cross-Racial Interaction is a unified measure of students' level of positive interaction with diverse peers.

Satisfaction with Coursework measures the extent to which students see their coursework as relevant, useful and applicable to their academic success and future plans.

Science Identity measures the extent to which students conceive of themselves as scientists.

- * *I think of myself as a scientist (8.18)*

Science Self-Efficacy is a measure of students' confidence in their ability to conduct scientific research.

Sense of Belonging measures the extent to which students feel a sense of academic and social integration on campus.

- * *If asked, I would recommend this college to others (5.18)*

Social Agency measures the extent to which students value political and social involvement as a personal goal.

Survey items and estimation "weights": Indicate the importance to you personally of each of the following:

- * *Helping to promote racial understanding (4.88)*
- * *Becoming a community leader (4.38)*
- * *Keeping up to date with political affairs (3.68)*

Social Self-Concept is a unified measure of students' beliefs about their abilities and confidence in social situations.



Significant Differences Across Specific Responses WFU '18 Men vs Women

Assuming the minimum number of WFU 2018 male respondents to any one particular survey item ($n=84$) along with the portion which will yield the largest margin of error (i.e. 50%), the conservative margin of error for WFU 2018 male respondents is 10.7%.

Similarly, assuming the minimum number of WFU 2018 female respondents to any one particular survey item ($n=109$), along with the portion which will yield the largest margin of error (i.e. 50%), the conservative margin of error for WFU 2018 female respondents is 9.4%.

However, items identified here relied upon each item's actual number of responses and proportions when testing whether the differences in proportions between the groups, at the 95% confidence interval, included 0.0, (i.e. there was likely no difference).

In the analysis, post-stratified weights were used to correct for bias due to nonresponse and underrepresented groups in the population.

Significant Differences Across Specific Responses WFU '18 White vs Under-Represented Minority Students(URM)

Assuming the minimum number of WFU 2018 white respondents to any one particular survey item ($n=138$) along with the portion which will yield the largest margin of error (i.e. 50%), the conservative margin of error for WFU 2018 white respondents is 8.3%.

Similarly, assuming the minimum number of WFU 2018 URM respondents to any one particular survey item ($n=49$), along with the portion which will yield the largest margin of error (i.e. 50%), the conservative margin of error for WFU 2018 URM respondents is 14.0%.

However, items identified here relied upon each item's actual number of responses and proportions when testing whether the differences in proportions between the groups, at the 95% confidence interval, included 0.0, (i.e. there was likely no difference).

In the analysis, post-stratified weights were used to correct for bias due to nonresponse and underrepresented groups in the population.

Significant Differences Across Specific Responses WFU '18 by Loan Amount

Assuming the minimum number of WFU 2018 respondents-without-loan to any one particular survey item ($n=38$) along with the portion which will yield the largest margin of error (i.e. 50%), the conservative margin of error for WFU 2018 respondents without loan is 15.9%.

Similarly, assuming the minimum number of WFU 2018 respondents-with-loan to any one particular survey item ($n=48$), along with the portion which will yield the largest margin of error (i.e. 50%), the conservative margin of error for WFU 2018 respondents with loan is 14.1%.

However, items identified here relied upon each item's actual number of responses and proportions when testing whether the differences in proportions between the groups, at the 95% confidence interval, included 0.0, (i.e. there was likely no difference).

In the analysis, post-stratified weights were used to correct for bias due to nonresponse and underrepresented groups in the population.










During The Past Year, How Many Hours Do You Spend In Typical Week Studying/Doing Homework?




During The Past Year, How Many Hours Do You Spend In Typical Week In Clubs/Groups?






Professors At Your Most Recent College Frequently Provided You With:


