Career Development in F&CS



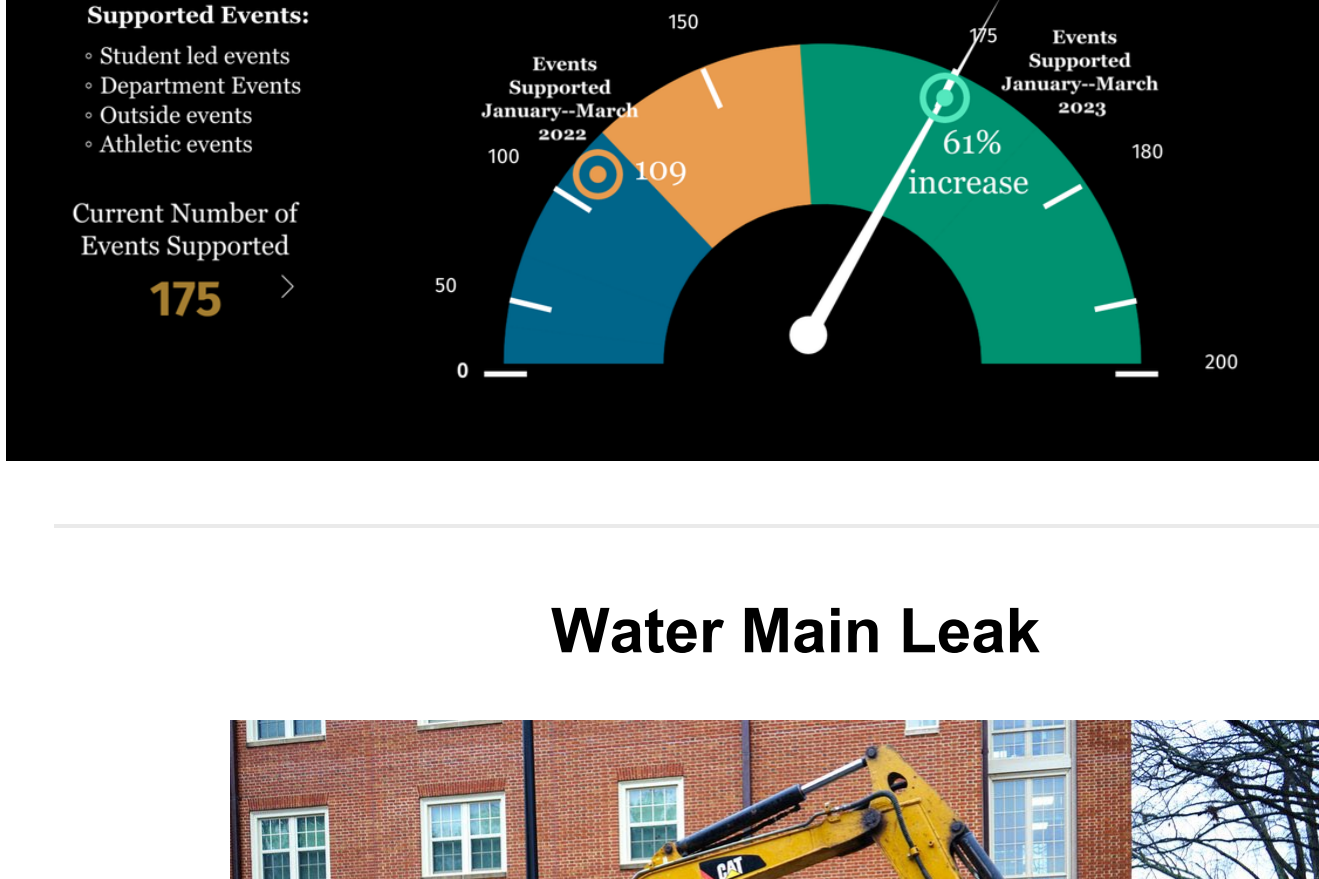

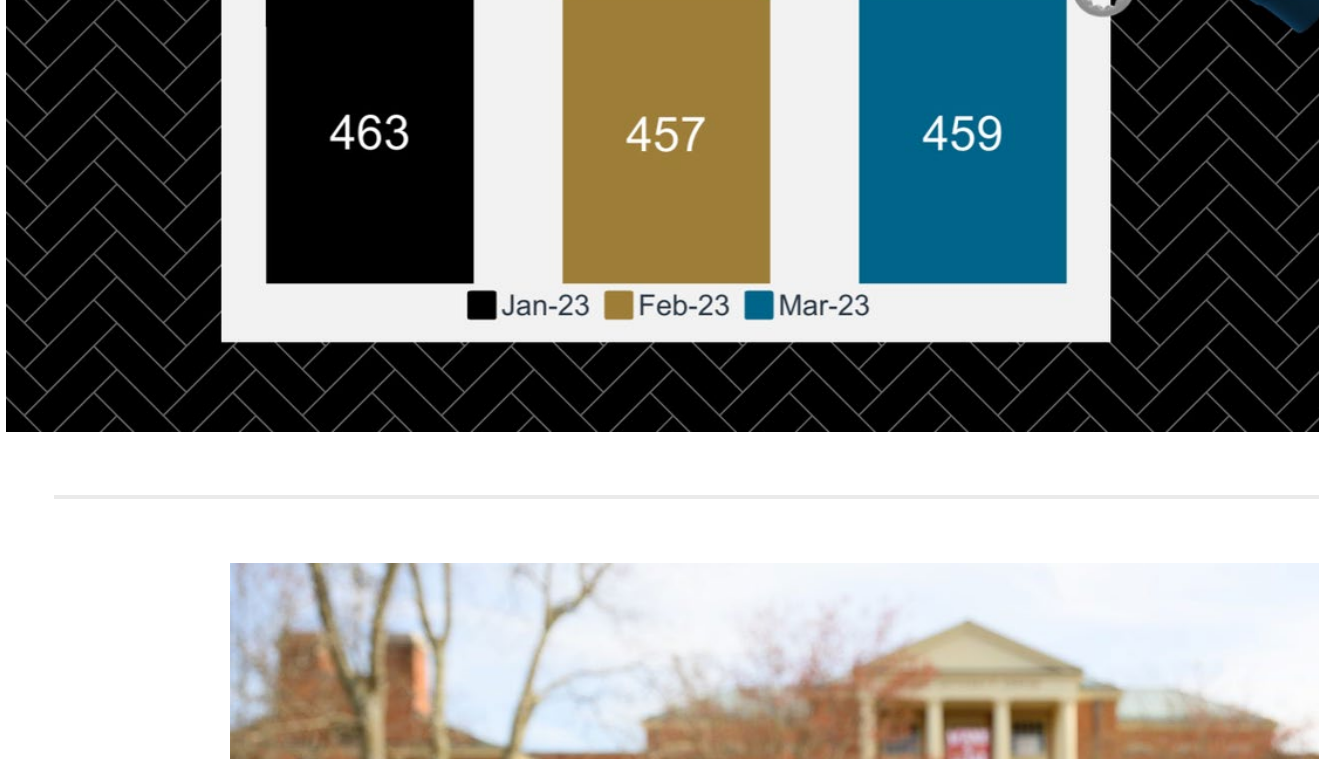


Water Main Leak



In February a water main leak led to a large sinkhole opening near Maya Angelou Hall along McPherson Road. Utility teams worked quickly to reroute water flow, isolate the leak, and make repairs. In addition, there was no interruption in water service to campus buildings. F&CS maintains over 4 miles of water distribution piping across Reynolda campus, supplied by two connections from the City of Winston Salem water system. Pipe shear caused by the ground settling over the years caused the leak. Facilities teams repaired the leak and returned the line back to service quickly, however due to the location of the leak and disturbance to the surrounding area clean up and final repairs to the area took a few weeks to finalize.

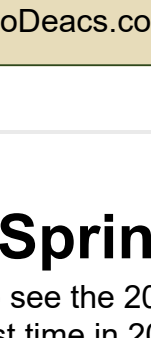
