She has been a tireless champion of educating the whole student, built critical first-year experience initiatives (including FYE 101, with its emphasis on academic success, wellbeing, and living in community), revamped lower division advising, expanded OAA support for faculty, created an annual faculty advising award, overseen the faculty fellows program in the first-year residences, partnered in the revision of new student orientation, headed the highly successful living and learning communities, supported CARE Team, and led Project Wake. Though modest and selfeffacing, Christy has been a true change agent, a fierce advocate for all our students in all their diversity, and while we will miss her in this role, we are fortunate our terrific colleague and exceptional teacher-scholar will be returning to the classroom.


## **NEW FACULTY IN THE FOREST - YEAR-END RECEPTION**

## SUMMER WRITING GRANTS

### Deadline for applications: Monday, April 15, 2019

Each summer the Humanities Institute funds up to four competitive <u>Summer Writing</u> <u>Grants</u> for faculty working in the humanities to complete or make significant progress on a manuscript for a monograph that is either under contract or in which a publisher has indicated written interest. Applications are open to all full-time faculty, with priority for two of the grants awarding proposals submitted by tenure-track humanities faculty working on a first monograph.

The ACE Fellows program ethically promotes and sustains community engaged teaching, research, and scholarship through the development of faculty as public intellectuals connecting their work with community needs and projects. ACE Fellows commit to two years in the program, starting a new project or developing deeper engagement around existing work. Thanks to funding from the <u>Andrew W. Mellon Foundation</u>, fellows receive a \$1,000 fellowship award annually. Interested Humanities faculty members must submit an <u>application</u>, a cover letter, and a copy of their CV to <u>Shelley Sizemore</u> by May 31st. <u>Jason Fanning</u> has been selected as the Wells Fargo Faculty Scholar. Jason is a Postdoctoral Fellow working with <u>Jack Rejeski</u> in the <u>Department of Health & Exercise</u>



<u>Science</u> and <u>Barbara Nicklas</u> in the <u>Department of Gerontology and</u> <u>Geriatric Medicine</u> at the School of Medicine. The Wells Fargo program funds the recruitment of faculty whose research shows promise for generating significant intellectual property and regionally-based commercialization efforts as either start-up or spin-off companies. Jason is currently working with the EMPOWER team on the

development of a mobile app for older adults meant to promote daily physical activity while breaking up bouts of sustained sitting time.
