

Enslaved Leadership in Early Christianity



Katherine A. Shaner is Associate Professor of New Testament at Wake Forest University School of Divinity. Shaner works with archaeological materials from modern-day Turkey, Greece, and Israel to help better understand the full context of the earliest Christian communities. She teaches courses across the New Testament and early Christian history that explore the theological, social, and political implications of biblical interpretation for contemporary communities. Throughout her teaching and scholarship she examines the intersections of race, class, and gender as well as the ethics of contemporary biblical interpretation. Shaner's book, *Enslaved Leadership in Early Christianity* (Oxford University Press, 2018), challenges readers to re-think common perceptions about how enslaved persons participated in early Christian communities.
