Internship Overview:

activities.

Qualifications/ Requirements:

- Preference is given to Wake Forest University undergraduate students or recent graduates
- Strong verbal and written communication skills
- Flexibility to work on call hours during the 6 week program and 2 weeks of preparation and training
- Mandatory Staff training will be held May 22nd-June 2nd
- Mandatory Program dates in Winston Salem are: June 11- Aug 4.
- Background check required

Compensation:

- Stipend for the 6 weeks of programming and 2 week of onsite training
- Access to all activities and off site trips
- Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner provided daily
