Clothing

Our dress code is casual, but clothing should be **appropriate** and prepare students for both chilly, air-conditioned classrooms and the sweltering North Carolina summers. Bring layers and consider bringing an umbrella and rain boots in case of rain.

Students are allowed to wear athletic attire during free time. **Please refer to [Institute Specific Items below for full dress code guidelines](#).** For example, some institutes will require a business casual outfit during presentations and field trips, and other institutes have specific dress code requirements for all five days of programming.

What to Bring:

- Attire for **five** days of academic programming
 - Pants, shorts (*shorts must be an appropriate length, fully covering the buttocks with at least a three-inch inseam*)
 - Shirts (*must be an appropriate length, reaching the waistband of your pants/shorts with no exposure of midriff*)
 - Socks
 - Undergarments
 - Sweatshirt
 - A light jacket and/or rain jacket
 - Pajamas
- Outdoor attire appropriate for evening activities/playing sports, etc.
 - Athletic attire
 - Tennis shoes
- Shoes
 - Comfortable walking shoes
 - Close-toed shoes
 - Shower sandals
- One business casual outfit (if required for your Institute)
 - This may include a collared shirt or blouse, pants or skirts, and close-toed shoes
 - Dresses and skirts must not be shorter than 4 inches above the knee

Linens

Mattresses are "twin, extra-long" (36 by 80 inches, about 6 inches thick). Extra-long fitted sheets or twin flat sheets will accommodate the mattress, but regular twin fitted sheets often will not fit. You may also wish to bring a mattress cover or pad.

What to Bring:

- Set of extra-long, fitted twin sheets
- Blanket
- Bedspread/comforter or sleeping bag
- Pillow and pillowcase

- Towels and/or bathrobe
- Washcloth
- Mattress cover/pad

Toiletries

Students will share a bathroom with the other students in their hall or suite. It will be helpful to have a bag/basket or caddy to carry needed items to the shower.

What to Bring:

- Shampoo and/or conditioner
- Soap and/or body wash
- Hand soap
- Hand sanitizer
- Deodorant
- Facewash
- Toothbrush
- Toothpaste
- Dental floss
- Facial tissues
- Sunblock
- Bug repellent

Miscellaneous

*Many of the items on this list are **optional** and merely suggestions for what to bring to Wake Forest this summer.*

- Alarm clock
- Backpack
- Basic school supplies
 - Pens/Pencils
 - Notebook
- Camera
- Cell phone and charger
- Extension cord/power strip
- Cleaning supplies (i.e. Clorox wipes)
- Clothes hangers (we do not provide these)

Biology Research Institute:

- **Clothing**
 - ***Students will need to wear long pants and close-toed shoes on Monday - Thursday.**
 - Comfortable closed-toed shoes for wearing both in lab and outside on pavement and grass
 - Shoes that can get a bit muddy or wet (rain boots, water shoes, etc.)
 - Changes of socks, in case your feet get wet
 - Shirts that cover your shoulders (for lab safety and sunburn protection)

- Long, lightweight pants for wearing both in lab and outside
- A rain jacket
- A hat and/or sunglasses
- Personal Items
 - Sunscreen
 - Bug spray
 - Refillable water bottle
 - Hair ties/scrunchies, if you have long hair
- Professional Items
 - Laptop*
