At this time, it is assumed that students will be allowed to be on campus for the summer of 2022, and your project should reflect in-person mentorship. Be sure that your project description includes the following:

Justification for your scholarly project (including Project Background, Rationale and Significance; 500 word maximum) A detailed description of your Project Methods (500 word maximum)

Describe how this fellowship will benefit your educational and/or career plan (250 word maximum)

Reminder: The Wake Forest Arts & Humanities Fellowship requires that students work full time on their projects. That is to say, students receiving this fellowship may not work outside the fellowship nor enroll in summer courses during the 5 consecutive weeks of the summer fellowship. Summer project dates should begin and end, between May 17 - August 16, 2022.

All equipment purchased for research must remain with the mentor as the department or lab's property, used as a resource for future research and/or study

2022 Update: We anticipate awarding fellowships to undergraduate students for summer 2022. However, students should discuss with their mentor the possibility of whether a remote project would be possible in the event that the campus closes for the summer.
