RESOLUTION

1 **WHEREAS:** The Wake Forest Law Review is hosting its annual symposium on January 28th
2 between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. in the Worrell Professional Center and via webinar. The Wake Law
3 Review has opened the symposium to all members of the Wake Forest community - including
4 undergraduates.

5 **WHEREAS:** The symposium, titled *Preserving American Democracy: Exploring Modern*
6 *Democracy through the History and Development of First Amendment Jurisprudence and*
7 *Election Law*, will feature speakers from across the country discussing timely issues concerning
8 the role of constitutional and election law in modern American democracy. The event will
9 feature such speakers as Alexander Tsesis, Michael J. Perry, Steven J. Heyman, Davison
10 Douglas, Mary-Rose Papandrea, John Llewellyn, Richard Hasen, Derek Muller, Michael
11 Morley, and Michael Kent Curtis.

12 **WHEREAS:** Art. III, § 2(2.) of the Wake Forest Student Government Constitution states that “[the
13 Senate] shall represent the interests of students in social and academic matters.” Art. III, § 2(3.) of the
14 Constitution states that “[the Senate] shall promote the funding and operations of beneficial programs

15 for the student body.”¹ Wake Forest Student Government has previously co-sponsored campus
16 events related to democracy and human rights.

17 **WHEREAS:** Wake Law Review is seeking additional support in promoting the event among
18 undergraduate students.

19 **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:**

- 20 1) Wake Forest Student Government will co-sponsor Wake Forest Law Review’s 2022
21 annual symposium.
- 22 2) The Public Relations Committee shall work to inform students of the event on social
23 media. Members of Student Government will also work to hang up the attached flyer for
24 the event, which will count as an extracurricular event.
