Summary:

While we will train student employees in their professional skills during their time on the marketing team, this position involves having effective communication skills and the ability to work independently, as well as, part of a team. Graphic Designers are responsible for upholding the brand standards as set forth by Wake Forest University and the Wellbeing Center through promoting the all-inclusive environment in which our events and programs occur.

Essential Functions:

- Positively represent the Wellbeing Center and Wake Forest University
- Perform duties such as: creating graphic materials in a timely manner to which they're
 assigned, communicating effectively with the marketing directors and professional staff,
 and submitting projects on time
- Other duties as assigned
- Able to respond to emails in a timely manner
- Able to complete assigned tasks in a timely manner
- Able to meet at least three times per semester with the entire team and/or in an individual meeting with the Marketing Director
