## **Abstract**

This pilot study examined counselor-in-training (CIT) attitudes and awareness regarding stigma and stigmatizing language aimed at those with substance use disorders before and after an author-developed educational intervention. Results indicated this intervention positively impacted CIT awareness and attitudes and their ability to identify and change stigmatizing language. Implications are discussed.

#### Words from the Authors

Stigma is pervasive in the SUD treatment field, and counselors are not immune to unwittingly perpetuating that stigma through the words they use. We know a lot about the harm stigmatizing

language can cause, and by developing and testing educational interventions, we hope to prepare future counselors to recognize and dismantle stigma, fostering more compassionate, evidence-based care.
