RAISE Center Mission:

To understand and enhance the experiences, engagement, and development of abroad and international students.

OVERVIEW

The 2021-2022 academic has been one of growth and sustained momentum for the RAISE Center. We are proud of our four team members pursuing advanced degrees; combined Porshè, Corinne, Fanyi, and Aiai have contributed to every research project of the RAISE Center and its predecessor research teams since 2016, resulting in authorship on seven published manuscripts and two currently under review. This year also brought Dr. Patrick Bingham to our team; Patrick streamlined our data cleaning process, building efficiencies into projects and the capacity of the RAISE Center.

Through external funding, we generated a large-scale multi-institutional longitudinal dataset for Project RISE (Research on the International Student Experience), providing researchers the capacity to identify key malleable university factors supporting international student engagement and development. A dedicated 10-person team created the Academic Research on Education Abroad (AREA) Database of 373 articles from 2001-2021 reporting outcomes of study abroad for students from U.S. universities. The AREA Database brings together the wide-ranging multidisciplinary field of study abroad research to allow researchers to identify key gaps and practitioners to draw on the evidence base so that we all can maximize the positive impact of study abroad for students.

As we look toward the 2022-2023 academic year, we are heartened by the progress of current projects, the development of the nascent line of inquiry on underrepresented populations studying abroad led by Dr. Bingham, and the cultivation of future opportunities for collaboration, both with colleagues at WFU and beyond.

COLLABORATIVE HIGHLIGHTS

Completed <u>Five-Year Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) Impact Report</u> for WFU SACSCOC Accreditation Committee, demonstrating the positive outcomes for participants in Global AWAKEnings, Global Connections, Global Laureates Academy, and Global Village.

Submitted grant application to the U.S. Department of Education in collaboration with Winston-Salem State University, the Z. Smith Reynolds Library, the Office of the Dean of the College, the WFU Department of Education, and the Center for Global Programs and Studies, to become a National Resource Center for Research and Assessment on International Scholarly Engagement.

The Undergraduate Richter Scholarship Committee, chaired by Executive Director Brunsting, awarded more than \$116,000 to 20 students pursuing independent research projects abroad in Summer 2022.

Three WFU faculty members led online courses with 48 Chinese students in Tsinglan School in Dongguan, China, via the Global Accelerator Program; curriculum efficacy assessment ongoing.
