INTERNAL NOMINATIONS for NEH SUMMER STIPENDS

Internal Deadline: Wednesday, July 31, 2024 NEH Deadline: Wednesday, September 18, 2024

Full-time faculty interested in applying for a National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) Summer Stipend must first be nominated by the university. Please send a 1-page abstract of the proposed project and a 1-page CV electronically to Aimee Mepham, HI Associate Director (mephamam@wfu.edu), by 5 P.M., Wednesday, July 31st, so that the candidate chosen will have time to prepare a complete proposal for the September 18th NEH deadline. The abstract should describe the work's significance, progress to date, and plan of work.

Each US college and university may nominate 1 faculty member. Adjunct faculty, faculty with appointments terminating in summer 2024, and independent scholars may apply directly, without nomination. Applicants must be US citizens or have lived in the US or its jurisdictions for at least the 3 years immediately preceding application; they may not have held a postdoctoral research award with a stipend of \$15K or more within the last 3 academic years with the exception of sabbaticals or internal grants.

Each Summer Stipend provides \$8K for 2 consecutive, uninterrupted months of full-time humanities research to produce articles, monographs, books, digital materials, archeological site reports, translations, editions, or other tools of value to scholars and general audiences.

"The term *humanities* includes, but is not limited to, the study of language, both modern and classical; linguistics; literature; history; jurisprudence; philosophy; archaeology; comparative religion; ethics; history, criticism, and theory of the arts; aspects of social sciences that have humanistic content and employ humanistic methods; and the study and application of the humanities to the human environment with particular attention to reflecting our diverse heritage, traditions, and history and to the relevance of the humanities to the conditions of national life."
