(a) Of the 22 amendments considered in Alabama, 2 appeared on the state-wide ballot, and 1 of these was approved. The other 20 amendments are local amendments that were voted on only by residents of the affected locality, and 17 were approved.

(b) Nevada voters also supported two other citizen-initiated amendments, regarding abortion rights and a voter ID requirement, but Nevada requires citizen-initiated amendments to be ratified in two consecutive general elections, and therefore these amendments will only be considered approved and take effect if they are supported by voters a second time, in the 2026 election. These two amendments are not included in these totals.
