To honor the 2,977 lives lost on 9/11, over 1000 participants were invited to climb a step for each life. This event was open to the entire Winston-Salem community, and this year we had the largest turnout in several years, with many community members, sports teams, and students from Wake Forest, Winston-Salem State, and Salem College.

#### **SUMMER BREAK**

This summer, our cadets were hard at work at various training opportunities around the globe. 14 Cadets attended and graduated from CST. Additionally, we had one cadet graduate from Airborne, three from Air Assault, and one from the Army Space Cadre Basic Course. #### Fall Field Training Exercise

September 19-21, 2025

FTX at Fort Bragg was a multi-day training event where 54 cadets were evaluated on an Air Assault O-Course, EIB skills, land navigation, and tactical skills in a realistic field environment during STX lanes. Cadets lead teams through missions such as patrols and ambushes, navigating challenging terrain and facing simulated opposition. The goal was to build resilience, teamwork, and confidence, preparing them for the challenges of being a future Army officer.

### **Alumni Spotlight**





Brigadier General Lubas was commissioned in 1997 and served in the 25th Infantry Division and the 75th Ranger Regiment. He commanded three separate battalions and brigades, including the 3rd Brigade, 25th Infantry Division. His senior staff roles included Executive Officer to the Secretary of the Army and Director of Operations (G-3/5/7) for the Headquarters Department of the Army. A highly decorated combat veteran with twelve deployments to Afghanistan and Iraq, BG Lubas now serves as the Commanding General of the 3rd Infantry Division (3rd ID). He holds the Distinguished Service Medal, Bronze Star Medal, and the Ranger Tab.



MG John A. Yingling

Major General John A. Yingling retired after 35 years of distinguished service, culminating his career as the Deputy Chief of Staff G3/5/7 for Army Forces Command (FORSCOM). A 1974 ROTC graduate of Wake Forest University, his senior commands included Deputy Commanding General of First Army, Commander of the 3rd Infantry Division Artillery, and Commanding General of Joint Task Force Six. Recognized with the Defense Superior Service Medal, MG Yingling is being honored for his exemplary service with his induction into the ROTC Hall of Fame.


