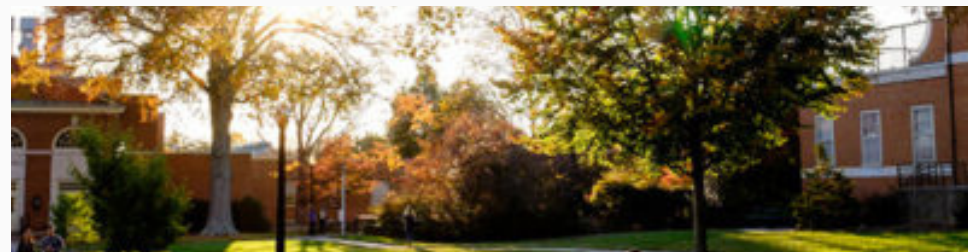

What Is Assignment Enhancement?

Assignment Enhancements is a recent update to the Classic Assignment Details page, improving the assignment interface and submission process for students. Teachers have the option to manage the feature preview on a course-by-course basis if it is enabled and unlocked. If disabled, the Classic Assignment Details will be used for all courses in the account.

Note: If students cannot access an assignment with Assignment Enhancements, it may be due to the feature preview for Assignment Enhancements - Student not being enabled or the assignment type not being supported. Refer to the instructions on how to view assignments for further details.

The assignment instructions in the 'Details' section are as follows:

This is first part of the three-part [Paper Assignment](#).

By now you should have attended 2 [field trips](#) and posted [group logs](#) of each. From those field trip observations, you should choose one observation to expand upon in a brief research paper.

Your research paper should be done **individually**, not as a group. It may be a good idea to choose your topics as a group to make sure no one is selecting the same observation.

Using at least 5 distinct resources found in the library, referenced by the textbook, or suggested by me, write a brief report (2000 words or less) or essay on the topic. A report is primarily factual; an essay relates facts to personal observations and insights. Choose whichever suits you best!

Either way, your paper should not just re-state your field observations--it certainly can build upon that work, but should include new information that hasn't been touched on yet.

The Assignment Enhancements page provides detailed assignment information:

- The Assignment Summary header showcases the assignment title, due date, and points available. Note that not all assignments may have a due date.
- Use the Attempt drop-down to access submission attempts for the assignment. By default, it shows your most recent attempt.
- The Progress Tracker indicates the submission and grading status of the assignment.
- Click the Add Comment button to view assignment feedback or add a comment for your instructor.
- Check the number of allowed attempts and availability dates.
- Assignment instructions are shown in the Details section.
- If a rubric was included, click the View Rubric link to see it.

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The latest submission is shown as [1].

Once a submission is graded, the grade appears as [2], and the Progress Tracker reflects the Review Feedback status [3].

In case of multiple submissions, they can be previewed by choosing the attempt from the Attempt drop-down [4].

If a rubric was utilized for grading, the completed rubric will be visible [5]. For assignments graded by multiple assessors using a rubric, you can check each assessor's evaluation by selecting them from the Select Grader drop-down [6]. Students can submit another attempt if allowed by clicking the New Attempt button [7].

Note: If students cannot resubmit work, it could be due to restrictions set by the instructor on the number of submissions allowed or the assignment's availability dates.
