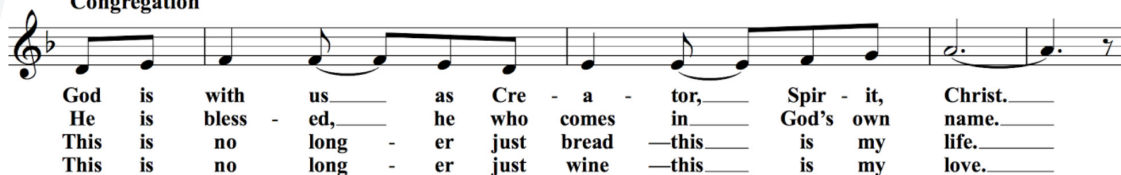
On the night when Jesus gave his life for many,
