## TODAY'S SPEAKER

Bishop Vashti Murphy McKenzie is the first female bishop in the African Methodist Episcopal Church. She currently serves as the presiding prelate of the 13th Episcopal District, which encompasses Tennessee and Kentucky. She is one of the best-known preachers in contemporary American Protestantism.

Bishop McKenzie was ordained in 1984. While pastor at the historic Payne Memorial AME Church in Baltimore, she was elected bishop of the church in 2000. She was the chief pastor of the 18th Episcopal District in southeast Africa, which includes Lesotho, Swaziland, Botswana and Mozambique, from 2000 to 2004. In 2005 she again made history by becoming the first female president of the Council of Bishops of the AME Church, and the Titular head of the Church.

She is the author of three books, including her latest, *Journey to the Well*, which encourages women to follow in the footsteps of the biblical Samaritan women. She received a Bachelor of Arts degree in journalism from the University of Maryland, College Park, a Master of Divinity from Howard University, and a Doctor of Ministry from United Theological Seminary in Ohio.
