#### TODAY'S SPEAKER:

Barbara Brown Taylor is an Episcopal priest who teaches religion at Piedmont College in rural northeast Georgia. She also serves as adjunct professor of Christian spirituality at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. Before becoming a full-time teacher in 1997, Taylor spent fifteen years in parish ministry, first at All Saints' Church in Atlanta and then at Grace-Calvary Church in Clarkesville, Georgia. In recent years, she has lectured on preaching at Yale, Princeton, and Duke universities, and she has preached at churches across the country. In 1995, Baylor University listed her among the twelve most effective preachers in the English language. A columnist for *The Christian Century* and occasional commentator on Georgia Public Radio, she is the author of ten books, including *When God is Silent* and *Home By Another Way*.




